

Let's Pray Together This Week

Sunday, July 17

Pray for our Sunday Supper tonight. Pray that as we hear reports of the wonderful works God accomplished in Haiti for and through our mission team members that our hearts are stirred. Pray that God gives each of us a renewed zeal for the ministry he has set before us and a desire to stretch ourselves to accomplish more for Him. Thank the Lord for the hands that will prepare our meal tonight. Pray that we have sweet fellowship amongst our church family.

Monday, July 18

Pray for the spiritual health of our congregation today. Pray that during a time of much change that God would strengthen us and unite our congregation with the goal to whole-heartily serve Him despite any challenges, difficulties, or emotional distress. Ask God to supply abundant joy and perseverance as we labor for Him and make it our goal to please Him in all we say, do and think.

Tuesday, July 19

Thursday, July 21

Pray for Christians in various forms of public leadership. Pray that they use their voice boldly to influence Godly change. Pray for the testimony of those that profess Christ as their Saviour, that they would live a life honoring to Him and be an example of a life transformed. Pray for our own testimonies as well, that we may be the example of Christ's love to others.

Friday, July 22

Saturday, July 23
